## 2 Safety instructions

#### Intended use

This device is intended for use as an electronic lighting effect by means of LED technology. The device is designed for professional use and is not suitable for use in households. Use the device only as described in this user manual. Any other use or use under other operating conditions is considered to be improper and may result in personal injury or property damage. No liability will be assumed for damages resulting from improper use.

This device may be used only by persons with sufficient physical, sensorial, and intellectual abilities and having corresponding knowledge and experience. Other persons may use this device only if they are supervised or instructed by a person who is responsible for their safety.

Extend the life of the device by regular breaks in operation and avoid switching it on and off frequently. This device is not suitable for continuous use.

### **Danger for children**

Ensure that plastic bags, packaging, etc. are disposed of properly and are not within reach of babies and young children. Choking hazard!

Ensure that children do not detach any small parts (e.g. knobs or the like) from the unit. They could swallow the pieces and choke!

Never let children unattended use electrical devices.

### Electric shock caused by high voltages inside

Within the device there are areas where high voltages may be present. Never remove any covers.

Strobe lighting can trigger seizures in photosensitive epilepsy. Sensitive persons should avoid looking at strobe lights.





#### Risk of fire

Do not block areas of ventilation. Do not install the device near any direct heat source. Keep the device away from naked flames.





## **Operating conditions**

This device has been designed for indoor use only. To prevent damage, never expose the device to any liquid or moisture. Avoid direct sunlight, heavy dirt, and strong vibrations.

Only operate the device within the ambient conditions specified in the chapter 'Technical specifications' of this user manual. Avoid heavy temperature fluctuations and do not switch the device on immediately after it was exposed to temperature fluctuations (for example after transport at low outside temperatures).

Dust and dirt inside can damage the unit. When operated in harmful ambient conditions (dust, smoke, nicotine, fog, etc.), the unit should be maintained by qualified service personnel at regular intervals to prevent overheating and other malfunction.





### **Power supply**

Before connecting the device, ensure that the input voltage (AC outlet) matches the voltage rating of the device and that the AC outlet is protected by a residual current circuit breaker. Failure to do so could result in damage to the device and possibly injure the user.

Unplug the device before electrical storms occur and when it is unused for long periods of time to reduce the risk of electric shock or fire.



## 3 Features

Special features of the device:

- 18 × six-colour LEDs (RGBAWUV), each 12 W
- Control via DMX (three different modes) and via buttons and display on the unit
- Automatic mode and sound control
- Master / Slave operation
- Robust metal housing in the colours black (item # 469039) or brushed silver (item # 469040) with mounting option for colour filters
- Also available in Tourpack 4 (black housing: Item no. 469058; brushed silver housing: Item no. 469056) with four spots CX-60 in a flight case.

For technological reasons, the light output of LEDs decreases over their lifetime. This effect increases with higher operating temperature. You can extend the service life of the illuminants by providing adequate ventilation and operating the LEDs with the lowest possible brightness.



## 4 Installation

Unpack and check carefully there is no transportation damage before using the unit. Keep the equipment packaging. To fully protect the product against vibration, dust and moisture during transportation or storage use the original packaging or your own packaging material suitable for transport or storage, respectively.



#### **WARNING!**

## Risk of injury caused by falling objects

Make sure that the installation complies with the standards and rules that apply in your country. Always secure the device with a secondary safety attachment, such as a safety cable or a safety chain.





### **Risk of overheating**

The distance between light output and the illuminated surface must be more than 1.5 m (19.7in).

Provide sufficient ventilation.

The ambient temperature must always be below 40 °C (104 °F).



#### NOTICE!

#### Use of stands



When mounting the device onto a stand, ensure that the stand is in a safe and stable position and that the weight of the device does not exceed the maximum permissible load capacity of the stand.





#### Possible data transmission errors

For error-free operation make use of dedicated DMX cables and do not use ordinary microphone cables.

Never connect the DMX input or output to audio devices such as mixers or amplifiers.



Please note that this device must not be connected to a dimmer.

### **Mounting options**

You can install the unit in hanging or standing position. When in use, the device must always be attached to a solid surface or an approved truss. Use the openings provided on the two-piece bracket for attaching.



Always work from a stable platform whenever installing, moving or servicing the unit. In doing so, the area underneath the unit must be cordoned off.

The safety cable must be attached to the bracket.




## 5 Starting up

Create all connections while the device is off. Use the shortest possible high-quality cables for all connections. Take care when running the cables to prevent tripping hazards.



#### Connections in DMX mode

Connect the DMX input of the device to the DMX output of a DMX controller or another DMX device. Connect the output of the first DMX device to the input of the second one, and so on to form a daisy chain. Always ensure that the output of the last DMX device in the daisy chain is terminated with a resistor (110  $\Omega$ ,  $\frac{1}{4}$  W).






# Connections in master/slave mode

When you configure a group of devices in master/slave mode, the first unit will control the other units for an automatic, sound-activated, synchronized show. This function is ideal when you want to start a show immediately. Connect the DMX output of the master device to the DMX input of the first slave device. Then connect the DMX output of the first slave device to the DMX input of the second slave device and so on.

## 7 Operating

## 7.1 Starting the device

Connect the device to the power supply to start operation. After a few seconds, the display indicates that a reset is in progress. The device is then ready for use.

### 7.2 Main menu

Press [M] to activate the main menu and the arrow buttons to select an operating mode. When the display shows the desired value, press [OK]. Use the arrow buttons to change the respectively displayed value. When the display shows the desired value, press [OK].

If you don't press any button for about 1 minute, the unit returns to the previously selected mode. The set values are retained even when the device is disconnected from the mains power supply.



#### DMX mode

Press [M]. Press one of the arrow buttons repeatedly until the display shows 'SET'. Press [OK]. Press one of the arrow buttons repeatedly until the display shows 'MODE'. Press [OK]. Now use the arrow buttons to select one of the following DMX modes:

- '6CH' (six channels)
- "8CH" (eight channels)
- '10CH' (ten channels)

This setting is only relevant when the device is controlled via DMX. When the display shows the desired value press [OK] to confirm the selection and then [M] to return to the parent menu. To return to the parent menu without making changes, press [M].



#### **DMX address**

Press [M]. Press one of the arrow buttons repeatedly until the display shows 'DMX'. Press [OK]. Now you can set the number of the first DMX channel to be used by the device (DMX address). Use the arrow buttons to select a value between 1 and 512 (display shows 'A001'...' 'A512').

When the display shows the desired value press [OK] to confirm the selection and then [M] to return to the parent menu. To return to the parent menu without making changes, press [M].

Make sure that this number matches the configuration of your DMX controller. The following table shows the highest possible DMX address for the various DMX modes.

Mode	Highest possible DMX address
6-channel	507
8-channel	505
10-channel	503



### **Programme speed**

Press [M]. Press one of the arrow buttons repeatedly until the display shows 'SET'. Press [OK]. Press one of the arrow buttons repeatedly until the display shows 'SPEE'. Press [OK]. Now you can adjust the programme speed for the preprogrammed automatic shows. Use the arrow buttons to select a value between 1 and 255 (display shows 'T001'... 'T255').

This setting is only relevant if the device is not controlled via DMX. When the display shows the desired value press [OK] to confirm the selection and then [M] to return to the parent menu. To return to the parent menu without making changes, press [M].

### Microphone sensitivity

Press [M]. Press one of the arrow buttons repeatedly until the display shows 'SET'. Press [OK]. Press one of the arrow buttons repeatedly until the display shows 'MIC'. Press [OK]. Now you can adjust the sensitivity of the built-in microphone for sound control. Use the arrow buttons to select either 'OFF' (microphone off) or a value between 1 and 30 (display shows 'M-01'... 'M-30').

This setting is only relevant if the device is not controlled via DMX. When the display shows the desired value press [OK] to confirm the selection and then [M] to return to the parent menu. To return to the parent menu without making changes, press [M].



#### Dimmer

Press [M]. Press one of the arrow buttons repeatedly until the display shows 'SET'. Press [OK]. Press one of the arrow buttons repeatedly until the display shows 'DIMM'. Press [OK]. Now you can set the intensity. Use the arrow buttons to select a value between 0 and 255 (display shows 'D000' ... 'D255').

This setting is only relevant if the device is not controlled via DMX. When the display shows the desired value press [OK] to confirm the selection and then [M] to return to the parent menu. To return to the parent menu without making changes, press [M].

### Turning the display on and off

Press [M]. Press one of the arrow buttons repeatedly until the display shows 'SET'. Press [OK]. Press one of the arrow buttons repeatedly until the display shows 'DISP'. Press [OK]. Use the arrow buttons to select one of the options 'ON' (display on) or 'OFF' (display off).

This setting is only relevant if the device is not controlled via DMX. When the display shows the desired value press [OK] to confirm the selection and then [M] to return to the parent menu. To return to the parent menu without making changes, press [M].



### Operating mode 'Show/Master'

Press [M]. Press one of the arrow buttons repeatedly until the display shows 'LINE'. Press [OK]. Press one of the arrow buttons repeatedly until the display shows 'MA'. Press [OK]. Now you can select one of the preprogrammed automatic shows. Use the arrow buttons to select a value between 1 and 42 (display shows 'P-01'... 'P-42').

The auto show can only be activated on the device that is configured as master.

This setting is only relevant if the device is not controlled via DMX. The device can operate in stand-alone mode or control connected devices of the same type, that must be configured as slaves. When the display shows the desired value press [OK] to confirm the selection and then [M] to return to the parent menu. To return to the parent menu without making changes, press [M].

### Operating mode 'Slave'

Press [M]. Press one of the arrow buttons repeatedly until the display shows 'LINE'. Press [OK]. Press one of the arrow buttons repeatedly until the display shows 'SL'. Press [OK]. Now you can set the number for the device via which it is addressed by the master as a slave. Use the arrow buttons to select a value between 1 and 512 (display shows 'A001'...'A512').

This setting is only relevant if the device is operating as Slave controlled by a Master, but not via DMX. When the display shows the desired value press [OK] to confirm the selection and then [M] to return to the parent menu. To return to the parent menu without making changes, press [M].



#### **Manual test**

Press [M]. Press one of the arrow buttons repeatedly until the display shows 'TEST'. Press [OK]. Press one of the arrow buttons repeatedly until the display shows 'CH1' to 'CH6' or 'STRO'. Press [OK]. Now you can set the brightness of the six basic colours, each in a range from 0 to 255, or select the strobe rate in a range of 0 to 24.

This mode is also suitable for generating constant or flashing light of a colour mixed from the four LED colours without DMX control.

When the display shows the desired value press [OK] to confirm the selection and then [M] to return to the parent menu. To return to the parent menu without making changes, press [M].

#### **Fade programmes**

Press [M]. Press one of the arrow buttons repeatedly until the display shows 'FADE'. Press [OK]. Now you can set the fade programmes of the preprogrammed automatic shows. Use the arrow buttons to select a value between 1 and 7 (display shows 'F-01'... 'F-07').

This setting is only relevant if the device is not controlled via DMX. When the display shows the desired value, press [OK] to confirm the selection and return to the main menu. To return to the main menu without making changes, press [M].




#### Colour selection

Press [M]. Press one of the arrow buttons repeatedly until the display shows 'COLO'. Press [OK]. Now you can set a basic colour for the preprogrammed automatic shows. Use the arrow buttons to select a value between 1 and 4 (display shows 'C-01'... 'C-04').

This setting is only relevant if the device is not controlled via DMX. When the display shows the desired value, press [OK] to confirm the selection and return to the main menu. To return to the main menu without making changes, press [M].

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

## 9 Plug and connection assignments

#### Introduction

This chapter will help you select the right cables and plugs to connect your valuable equipment so that a perfect light experience is guaranteed.

Please take our tips, because especially in 'Sound & Light' caution is indicated: Even if a plug fits into a socket, the result of an incorrect connection may be a destroyed DMX controller, a short circuit or 'just' a not working light show!

#### DMX connections



The unit offers a 3-pin XLR socket for DMX output and a 3-pin XLR plug for DMX input. Please refer to the drawing and table below for the pin assignment of a suitable XLR plug.

Pin	Configuration
1	Ground, shielding
2	Signal inverted (DMX–, 'cold signal')
3	Signal (DMX+, 'hot signal')

# 10 Troubleshooting



#### NOTICE!

#### Possible data transmission errors

For error-free operation make use of dedicated DMX cables and do not use ordinary microphone cables.

Never connect the DMX input or output to audio devices such as mixers or amplifiers.

In the following we list a few common problems that may occur during operation. We give you some suggestions for easy troubleshooting:



Symptom	Remedy
The unit does not work, no light.	Check the mains connection and the fuse.
No response to the DMX con-	1. Check the DMX ports and cables for proper connection.
troller.	2. Check the address settings and the DMX polarity.
	3. Try using another DMX controller.
	4. Check to see if the DMX cables run near or alongside to high voltage cables that may cause damage or interference to DMX interface circuits.

## 11 Cleaning

#### **Optical lenses**

Clean the optical lenses, that are accessible from the outside, regularly in order to optimize the light output. The frequency of cleaning depends on the operating environment: wet, smoky or particularly dirty surroundings can cause more accumulation of dirt on the optics of the device.

- Clean with a soft cloth using our lamp and lens cleaner (item no. 280122).
- Always dry the parts carefully.

#### Fan grids

The fan grids of the device must be cleaned of any contamination, such as dust, etc. on a regular basis. Before cleaning, switch off the device and disconnect mains-operated devices from the mains. Only use pH-neutral, solvent-free and non-abrasive cleaning agents. Clean the unit with a slightly damp lint-free cloth.
