1.3 Symbols and signal words

In this section you will find an overview of the meaning of symbols and signal words that are used in this manual.

Signal word	Meaning

2 Safety instructions

Intended use

This device is intended to be used as an electronic illumination effect using LED technics. The device is designed for professional use and is not suitable for use in households. Use the device only as described in this user manual. Any other use or use under other operating conditions is considered to be improper and may result in personal injury or property damage. No liability will be assumed for damages resulting from improper use.

This device may be used only by persons with sufficient physical, sensorial, and intellectual abilities and having corresponding knowledge and experience. Other persons may use this device only if they are supervised or instructed by a person who is responsible for their safety.

Safety



DANGER!

Danger for children

Ensure that plastic bags, packaging, etc. are disposed of properly and are not within reach of babies and young children. Choking hazard!

Ensure that children do not detach any small parts (e.g. knobs or the like) from the unit. They could swallow the pieces and choke!

Never let children unattended use electrical devices.



DANGER!

Electric shock caused by high voltages inside

Within the device there are areas where high voltages may be present. Never remove any covers.

There are no user-serviceable parts inside.

Do not use the device if covers, protectors or optical components are missing or damaged.



DANGER!

Electric shock caused by short-circuit

Always use proper ready-made insulated mains cabling (power cord) with a protective contact plug. Do not modify the mains cable or the plug. Failure to do so could result in electric shock/death or fire. If in doubt, seek advice from a registered electrician.



WARNING!

Eye damage caused by high light intensity

Never look directly into the light source.



WARNING!

Risk of epileptic shock

Strobe lighting can trigger seizures in photosensitive epilepsy. Sensitive persons should avoid looking at strobe lights.



NOTICE!

Risk of fire

Do not block areas of ventilation. Do not install the device near any direct heat source. Keep the device away from naked flames.



NOTICE!

Operating conditions

This device has been designed for indoor use only. To prevent damage, never expose the device to any liquid or moisture. Avoid direct sunlight, heavy dirt, and strong vibrations.



NOTICE!

Power supply

Before connecting the device, ensure that the input voltage (AC outlet) matches the voltage rating of the device and that the AC outlet is protected by a residual current circuit breaker. Failure to do so could result in damage to the device and possibly injure the user.

Unplug the device before electrical storms occur and when it is unused for long periods of time to reduce the risk of electric shock or fire.

3 Features

The device is suitable for almost all applications, for example in clubs, bars, small stages and theatres. It is characterized by compact dimensions and maximum flexibility.

Special features of the device:

- $144 \times \text{colour LEDs}$, each 10 mm (36 × red, 48 × green, 36 × blue, 24 × white)
- with double bracket for easy setup or mounting
- Control via DMX, buttons and display on the unit as well as via remote control (included)
- Automatic mode and sound control
- Master / Slave operation

4 Installation

Unpack and carefully check that there is no transportation damage before using the unit. Keep the equipment packaging. To fully protect the device against vibration, dust and moisture during transportation or storage use the original packaging or your own packaging material suitable for transport or storage, respectively.



WARNING!

Risk of injury caused by falling objects

Make sure that the installation complies with the standards and rules that apply in your country. Always secure the device with a secondary safety attachment, such as a safety cable or a safety chain.



NOTICE!

Risk of overheating

Always ensure sufficient ventilation.

The ambient temperature must always be below 40 °C (104 °F).



NOTICE!

Use of stands



When mounting the device onto a stand, ensure that the stand is in a safe and stable position and that the weight of the device does not exceed the maximum permissible load capacity of the stand.



NOTICE!

Possible data transmission errors

For error-free operation make use of dedicated DMX cables and do not use ordinary microphone cables.

Never connect the DMX input or output to audio devices such as mixers or amplifiers.

Mounting options

You can install the unit in hanging or standing position. When in use, the device must always be attached to a solid surface or an approved truss. Use the openings provided on the two-piece bracket for attaching.

Always work from a stable platform whenever installing, moving or servicing the unit. In doing so, the area underneath the unit must be cordoned off.

The safety-rope must be attached to the bracket.




Please note that this device must not be connected to a dimmer.

5 Starting up


Create all connections while the device is off. Use the shortest possible high-quality cables for all connections. Take care when running the cables to prevent tripping hazards.

Connections in DMX mode

Connect the DMX input of the device to the DMX output of a DMX controller or another DMX device. Connect the output of the first DMX device to the input of the second one, and so on to form a daisy chain. Always ensure that the output of the last DMX device in the daisy chain is terminated with a resistor (110 Ω , $\frac{1}{4}$ W).




6 Connections and controls



1	Display and function buttons.
	[ENTER]
	Confirms a selected value.
	[DOWN]
	Button to decrease the displayed value by one.
	[UP]
	Button to increase the displayed value by one.
	[MENU]
	Calls up the main menu or a submenu.
2	DMX input.
3	DMX output
4	Plug for mains cable.
5	Connection for the power cable to supply additional devices.

- 6 Locking screws for the mounting bracket.
- 7 Bracket for floor placement or hanging.

Remote control



8	Button to turn the device on and off.
9	[DMX]
	Button to switch between DMX and stand-alone mode.
10	[SLAVE]
	Button to switch between master and slave mode.
11	[AUTO 1], [AUTO 2], [SPEED]
	Buttons to activate automatic mode 1 or 2 and to adjust the programme speed.
12	[UP], [DOWN]
	Buttons to switch between programmes and to increase / decrease numeric values.

7 Operating

7.1 Starting the device

Turn on the power using the main switch. After a few seconds, the fan starts. The display shows the current operation mode.

7.2 Operating on the unit

DMX mode, DMX address Press [MENU], [UP] or [DOWN] repeatedly until the display shows 'Addr'. Confirm with [ENTER].

Now you can set the number of the first DMX channel to be used by the device (DMX address). Use [UP] and [DOWN] to select a value between 1 and 512 (the display shows 'A001' ... 'A512').

Confirm with [ENTER].

Sound control Press [MENU], [UP] or [DOWN] repeatedly until the display shows 'Soun'. Confirm with [ENTER].

Use [UP] and [DOWN] to select the desired mode 'Sou1' or 'Sou2'. Confirm with [ENTER].

Operating mode Auto

Press [MENU], [UP] or [DOWN] repeatedly until the display shows 'Auto'. Confirm with [ENTER].

Use [UP] and [DOWN] to select the desired mode 'Aut1' or 'Aut2'. Confirm with [ENTER]. Now

you can adjust the progress speed of the programme between 'SP 1' and 'SP 9'.

Constant colour

Press [MENU], [UP] or [DOWN] repeatedly until the display shows 'Colo'. Confirm with [ENTER].

Use [UP] and [DOWN] to select a constant colour in the range of 'Col1' ... 'Col9' or the option

'AtF'. Confirm with [ENTER]

In AtF mode, you can create custom colour blends by adjusting the red, green, blue, and white colour intensities in a range of '1' ... '255'. Confirm each colour setting with [ENTER] to move

to the next colour in the menu.

Operating mode Slave

Press [MENU], [UP] or [DOWN] repeatedly until the display shows 'SLav'. Confirm with [ENTER].

The display shows 'Sla', the unit is now in Slave mode.

Showing software version


Press [MENU], [UP] or [DOWN] repeatedly until the display shows 'uer'. Confirm with [ENTER].

The display shows the version number of the currently installed software.

7.3 IR remote control

Press [MENU], [UP] or [DOWN] repeatedly until the display shows 'rEno'. Confirm with [ENTER]. Use [UP] and [DOWN] to select the option 'on' to enable IR remote control. Confirm with [ENTER].



9 Plug and connection assignments

Introduction

This chapter will help you select the right cables and plugs to connect your valuable equipment so that a perfect light experience is guaranteed.

Please take our tips, because especially in 'Sound & Light' caution is indicated: Even if a plug fits into a socket, the result of an incorrect connection may be a destroyed DMX controller, a short circuit or 'just' a not working light show!

DMX connections



The unit offers a 3-pin XLR socket for DMX output and a 3-pin XLR plug for DMX input. Please refer to the drawing and table below for the pin assignment of a suitable XLR plug.

Pin	Configuration
1	Ground, shielding
2	Signal inverted (DMX–, 'cold signal')
3	Signal (DMX+, 'hot signal')

10 Troubleshooting



NOTICE!

Possible data transmission errors

For error-free operation make use of dedicated DMX cables and do not use ordinary microphone cables.

Never connect the DMX input or output to audio devices such as mixers or amplifiers.

In the following we list a few common problems that may occur during operation. We give you some suggestions for easy troubleshooting:

Symptom	Remedy	
The unit does not work, no light	Check the mains connection.	
Apparently no function despite proper power supply	Check if the unit is in DMX mode or in 'slave' mode. If so, check the unit in another mode.	
No response to the DMX controller	1. Check whether the DMX controller is switched on. Check the DMX connectors and cables for proper connection.	
	2. Check the address settings and the DMX polarity.	
	3. Try using another DMX controller.	
	4. Check whether the DMX cables run near or parallel to high-voltage cables that may cause damage or interference to a DMX interface circuit.

11 Cleaning

Optical lenses

Clean the optical lenses, that are accessible from the outside, regularly in order to optimize the light output. The frequency of cleaning depends on the operating environment: wet, smoky or particularly dirty surroundings can cause more accumulation of dirt on the optics of the device.

- Clean with a soft cloth using our lamp and lens cleaner (item no. 280122).
- Always dry the parts carefully.

Fan grids

The fan grids of the device must be cleaned on a regular basis to remove dust and dirt. Before cleaning, switch off the device and disconnect AC-powered devices from the mains. Use a lint-free damp cloth for cleaning. Never use solvents or alcohol for cleaning.

12 Protecting the environment

Disposal of the packaging material



For the transport and protective packaging, environmentally friendly materials have been chosen that can be supplied to normal recycling.

Ensure that plastic bags, packaging, etc. are properly disposed of.

Do not just dispose these materials with your normal household waste, but make sure that they are fed to a recovery. Please follow the notes and markings on the packaging.

Disposal of batteries
