2 Safety instructions

Intended use

This device is designed for sound reinforcement. Use the device only as described in this user manual. Any other use or use under other operating conditions is considered to be improper and may result in personal injury or property damage. No liability will be assumed for damages resulting from improper use.

This device may be used only by persons with sufficient physical, sensorial, and intellectual abilities and having corresponding knowledge and experience. Other persons may use this device only if they are supervised or instructed by a person who is responsible for their safety.

DANGER!

Risk of injury and choking hazard for children!

Children can suffocate on packaging material and small parts. Children can injure themselves when handling the device. Never allow children to play with the packaging material and the device. Always store packaging material out of the reach of babies and small children. Always dispose of packaging material properly when it is not in use. Never allow children to use the device without supervision. Keep small parts away from children and make sure that the device does not shed any small parts (such knobs) that children could play with.



DANGER!

Danger to life due to electric current!

Within the device there are areas where high voltages may be present. Never remove any covers. There are no user-serviceable parts inside. Do not use the device when covers, safety equipment or optical components are missing or damaged.



DANGER!

Danger to life due to electric current!

A short circuit could lead to a fire hazard and risk of death. Always use proper ready-made insulated triple-core mains cable with a safety plug. Do not modify the mains cable or the plug. In case of isolation damage, disconnect immediately the power supply and arrange repair. If in doubt, seek advice from a qualified electrician.



WARNING!

Possible hearing damage due to operating the device at a high volume!

The device can produce volume levels that, when operated at a high volume, may cause temporary or permanent hearing impairment. Over an extended period of time, even levels that seem to be uncritical can cause hearing damage. Avoid operating the device at excessively high volumes over an extended period of time. Decrease the volume level immediately if you experience ringing in your ears or hearing impairment. If this is not possible, keep a greater distance or use adequate ear-muffs.



NOTICE!

Risk of fire due to covered vents and neighbouring heat sources!

If the vents of the device are covered or the device is operated in the immediate vicinity of other heat sources, the device can overheat and burst into flames. Never cover the device or the vents. Do not install the device in the immediate vicinity of other heat sources. Never operate the device in the immediate vicinity of naked flames.



NOTICE!

Damage to the device if operated in unsuitable ambient conditions!

The device can be damaged if it is operated in unsuitable ambient conditions. Only operate the device indoors within the ambient conditions specified in the "Technical specifications" chapter of this user manual. Avoid operating it in environments with direct sunlight, heavy dirt and strong vibrations. Avoid operating it in environments with strong temperature fluctuations. If temperature fluctuations cannot be avoided (for example after transport in low outside temperatures), do not switch on the device immediately. Never subject the device to liquids or moisture. Never move the device to another location while it is in operation. In environments with increased dirt levels (for example due to dust, smoke, nicotine or mist): Have the device cleaned by qualified specialists at regular intervals to prevent damage due to overheating and other malfunctions.

NOTICE!

Damage to the device due to high voltages!

The device can be damaged if it is operated with the incorrect voltage or if high voltage peaks occur. In the worst case, excess voltages can also cause a risk of injury and fires. Make sure that the voltage specification on the device matches the local power grid before plugging in the device. Only operate the device from professionally installed mains sockets that are protected by a residual current circuit breaker (FI). Ensure that the power cord plug is easily accessible at all times if it is the only device to safely disconnect the device from the mains supply. As a precaution, disconnect the device from the power grid when storms are approaching or it the device will not be used for a longer period.

NOTICE!

Risk of fire due to installation of a wrong fuse!

Using fuses of a different type than compatible with the device may cause a fire and seriously damage the device. Only use fuses of the same type. Observe the labelling on the device casing and the information in the "Technical data" chapter.

NOTICE!

Potential property damage due to unsuitable stands!

• If the device is mounted on an unsuitable stand, there is a risk that the stand will fall over and cause damage. Only use stands whose maximum bearing capacity is at least as high as the weight of the device. Always ensure that the stand is stable.

NOTICE!

Possible staining due to plasticiser in rubber feet!

The plasticiser contained in the rubber feet of this product may react with the coating of the floor and cause permanent dark stains after some time. If necessary, use a suitable mat or felt slide to prevent direct contact between the device's rubber feet and the floor.

3 Features

- Coaxial 5.25-inch driver
- Built-in 120 watt RMS Class-D power amplifier
- 3-channel mixer with 2 × microphone/line inputs and 1 × cinch and mini jack input
- Additional line input on the back
- 3-band tone control
- Direct out on the back
- Frequency range 70 Hz 20 kHz
- Automatic shut-off without signal (can be deactivated)
- Can be mounted on microphone stands via 3/8-inch stand holder

4 Starting up

Unpack and check carefully there is no transportation damage before using the unit. Keep the equipment packaging. To fully protect the product against vibration, dust and moisture during transportation or storage use the original packaging or your own packaging material suitable for transport or storage, respectively.

Create all connections while the device is off. Use the shortest possible high-quality cables for all connections. Take care when running the cables to prevent tripping hazards.



NOTICE!

Possible property damage to adjacent devices due to magnetic fields.

Speakers generate a static magnetic field. This magnetic field can affect other neighbouring units and in unfavourable cases damage them.

Ensure that speakers are always a sufficient distance away from sensitive equipment that may be affected by an external magnetic field.



NOTICE!

Potential property damage due to unsuitable stands!

If the device is mounted on an unsuitable stand, there is a risk that the stand will fall over and cause damage.

Only use stands whose maximum bearing capacity is at least as high as the weight of the device. Always ensure that the stand is stable.

4.1 Tips on handling speakers

We recommend you to set up the speakers in a way, that the sound signals can reach the audience unobstructedly. It will often be helpful to mount the speakers on tripods. Thus, the sound will be evenly spread with maximum range throughout the audience area.


Always use high grade cable to connect your equipment. Otherwise you won't reach maximum sound quality.

For optimum results both impedance and power handling of the speakers must match the requirements of the amplifier. Always follow the technical specifications of the speakers! The overall impedance of the connected loudspeakers must not deceed the minimum output impedance of the amp. The amps max. RMS output power should be 50 % above the power handling capacity of the connected speakers.

If you notice distortion during operation, either the amp or the speaker is overloaded. This may permanently damage the amp or the speaker. Always reduce the volume when you hear distortion.

5 Connections and controls



1	[Pass] Pass control
1	[Bass] Bass control
2	[Mid] Mids control
3	[Treble] Treble control
4	[Main Level] Overall volume control
5	[Line \mid 0 dB \mid Mic] \mid Gain control for the second Line/Mic input. Turning clockwise (above/to the right of the 0 dB position) increases the input gain for the microphone level. Turning anti-clockwise (below/to the left of the 0 dB position) decreases the input gain for the connection of instruments or line level output devices.
6	[Clip] LED to indicate overload in the channel. If the LED lights up frequently, turn the gain control for this channel back slightly.
7	[Line/Mic] XLR / jack combo socket for connecting microphones, instruments or line level output devices
8	Handle for carrying or positioning the device
9	Seat for the supplied swivel adapter with 3/8-inch inner thread for attaching the device to a microphone stand.
10	[MP3] 3.5-mm jack socket for connecting line level players such as MP3 or CD players. Stereo signals are combined.
11	[Line/Mic] XLR / jack combo socket for connecting microphones, instruments or line level output devices
12	Cinch sockets for connecting line level players such as MP3 or CD players. Stereo signals are combined.
13	[Clip] LED to indicate overload in the channel. If the LED lights up frequently, turn the gain control for this channel back slightly.
14	[MP3/RCA] Volume control for the MP3/cinch inputs.

15	[Line 0 dB Mic] Gain control for the first Line/Mic input. Turning clockwise (above/to the right of the 0 dB position) increases the input gain for the microphone level. Turning anti-clockwise (below/to the left of the 0 dB position) decreases the input gain for the connection of instruments or line level output devices.
16	[On Signal Limit Protect] The [On] LED lights up when the device is on.
	The [Signal] LED lights up when a signal is present on at least one input and the gain or volume control for that input is turned up sufficiently to reproduce the signals.
	The [Limit] LED lights up when the circuit to limit the overall signal is activated. This is to protect the device against overload. In this case, reduce the overall volume.
	The [Protect] LED lights up when the internal protection circuit intervenes and prevents further operation. Turn off the device, wait one minute and then turn it on again.
17	Speakers
18	3/8-inch inner thread for attaching a microphone holder or swivel arm. An adapter (optional, item no. 480295) may be required in order to attach a swivel arm.

Connections and controls

1	[Line in] XLR / jack combo socket as additional line input, for example for importing an external monitor mix
2	[Auto Power off] If this switch is in the [Enable] position, the device is automatically turned off after approx. 30 minutes without an input signal. To turn it back on again, turn the [Power] switch off and on again.
3	[Power] Main switch. Turns the device on and off.
4	Rubber panel plug with fuse holder for the power supply
5	Housing recess for the included stand pin; if it is screwed to a stand, it allows the device to be set up at three different vertical angles.
6	[Direct out] This XLR panel plug loops through the signal from the [Line in] input in order to transfer it to other devices, for example



7 Plug and pin assignments

Introduction

This chapter will help you select the right cables and plugs to connect your valuable equipment in such a way that a perfect sound experience is ensured.

Please note these advices, because especially in 'Sound & Light' caution is indicated: Even if a plug fits into the socket, an incorrect connection may result in a destroyed power amp, a short circuit or 'just' in poor transmission quality!

Balanced and unbalanced transmission

Unbalanced transmission is mainly used in semi-professional environment and in hifi use. Instrument cables with two conductors (one core plus shielding) are typical representatives of the unbalanced transmission. One conductor is ground and shielding while the signal is transmitted through the core.

Unbalanced transmission is susceptible to electromagnetic interference, especially at low levels, such as microphone signals and when using long cables.

In a professional environment, therefore, the balanced transmission is preferred, because this enables an undisturbed transmission of signals over long distances. In addition to the conductors 'Ground' and 'Signal', in a balanced transmission a second core is added. This also transfers the signal, but phase-shifted by 180°.

Since the interference affects both cores equally, by subtracting the phase-shifted signals, the interfering signal is completely neutralized. The result is a pure signal without any noise interference.

1/4" TRS phone plug (mono, balanced)




1	Signal (in phase, +)

8 Cleaning

Device components

Clean the device components that are accessible from the outside regularly. The cleaning frequency depends on the operating environment: damp, smoky or particularly dirty environments can cause greater accumulation of dirt on the device components.

- Clean with a dry soft cloth.
- Stubborn dirt can be removed with a slightly dampened cloth.
- Never use solvents or alcohol for cleaning.

Disposal of the packing material
