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1 General information

1.1 Symbols and signal words

Intended use

This appliance is designed for professional use only and is intended to be used to control the brightness of connected spotlights. Use the device only as described in this user manual. Any other use or use under other operating conditions is considered to be improper and may result in personal injury or property damage. No liability will be assumed for damages resulting from improper use.

This device may be used only by persons with sufficient physical, sensorial, and intellectual abilities and having corresponding knowledge and experience. Other persons may use this device only if they are supervised or instructed by a person who is responsible for their safety.

Safety



DANGER!

Risk of injury and choking hazard for children!

Children can suffocate on packaging material and small parts. Children can injure themselves when handling the device. Never allow children to play with the packaging material and the device. Always store packaging material out of the reach of babies and small children. Always dispose of packaging material properly when it is not in use. Never allow children to use the device without supervision. Keep small parts away from children and make sure that the device does not shed any small parts (such knobs) that children could play with.



DANGER!

Danger to life due to electric current!

Within the device there are areas where high voltages may be present. Never remove any covers. There are no user-serviceable parts inside. Do not use the device when covers, safety equipment or optical components are missing or damaged.

The connection of screw terminals and all maintenance and repair work on the electrical installation of the device may only be performed by a qualified electrician. NOTICE!

Risk of fire due to covered vents and neighbouring heat sources!

If the vents of the device are covered or the device is operated in the immediate vicinity of other heat sources, the device can overheat and burst into flames. Never cover the device or the vents. Do not install the device in the immediate vicinity of other heat sources. Never operate the device in the immediate vicinity of naked flames.

NOTICE!

Damage to the device if operated in unsuitable ambient conditions!

The device can be damaged if it is operated in unsuitable ambient conditions. Only operate the device indoors within the ambient conditions specified in the "Technical specifications" chapter of this user manual. Avoid operating it in environments with direct sunlight, heavy dirt and strong vibrations. Avoid operating it in environments with strong temperature fluctuations. If temperature fluctuations cannot be avoided (for example after transport in low outside temperatures), do not switch on the device immediately. Never subject the device to liquids or moisture. Never move the device to another location while it is in operation. In environments with increased dirt levels (for example due to dust, smoke, nicotine or mist): Have the device cleaned by qualified specialists at regular intervals to prevent damage due to overheating and other malfunctions.

NOTICE!

Damage to the device due to high voltages!

The device can be damaged if it is operated with the incorrect voltage or if high voltage peaks occur. In the worst case, excess voltages can also cause a risk of injury and fires. Make sure that the voltage specification on the device matches the local power grid before plugging in the device. Only operate the device from professionally installed mains sockets that are protected by a residual current circuit breaker (FI). As a precaution, disconnect the device from the power grid when storms are approaching or it the device will not be used for a longer period.

3 Features

General features

- 12 dimmer channels
- 12-channel installation dimmer with connection terminals
- Control via DMX 512, Art-Net or manually via buttons and display on the unit
- Built-in DMX recorder for recording and storing of up to 99 static scenes
- Scenes can be played as a chase in a loop with adjustable fade time
- Live display for dimmer channel status
- Dimmer curve or switch mode adjustable per channel
- Silent mode for noise-sensitive environments

4 Installation and starting up

Unpack and check carefully there is no transportation damage before using the unit. Keep the equipment packaging. To fully protect the product against vibration, dust and moisture during transportation or storage use the original packaging or your own packaging material suitable for transport or storage, respectively.

Create all connections while the device is off. Use the shortest possible high-quality cables for all connections. Take care when running the cables to prevent tripping hazards.

The device is designed for mounting in 19" racks, it occupies two rack units (RU).

Connector

First, connect the loads to the terminals on the back of the device. Establish the DMX link to the controller. Connect the mains connection terminals with a mains cable. Finally, connect the power plug of the device to a 32 A CEE socket.

Connection options for blocks L1, L2 and L3:

- one block per phase
- one block to one phase, two blocks to a second phases
- all blocks to one phase




Regardless of the actual use, all three blocks should always be connected.

Connections in 'DMX' mode

Connect the DMX input of the device to the DMX output of a DMX controller or another DMX device. Connect the output of the first DMX device to the input of the second one and so on, to form a series connection. Make sure that the output of the last DMX device in the chain is terminated by a resistor (110 Ω , $\frac{1}{4}$ W).


5 Connections and controls

6 Operating

Turning the device on / off

- 1. Connect the device to the power supply.
 - ⇒ The [POWER] LED lights up. The display shows 'Initialize...' while the device is starting up. The start sequence is finished when the current device settings are shown on the display. The device is operational.
- **2.** Switch on the required channels using the assigned circuit breakers.
- **3.** To switch off the device, pull the mains plug from the 32 A CEE socket.

6.1 Main menu

- **1.** Press [MENU] to activate the main menu.
- 2. ▶ Press ▼ or ▲ repeatedly until the desired submenu is shown on the display.
- **3.** ▶ Press ▶ to scroll through the various options of the submenu or to move the cursor to the right.
- **4.** Press [ENTER] to activate a displayed sub menu.
- **5.** Press [ESC] to exit the menu and return to display mode.

Operating

After 5 seconds of inactivity, the menu is closed and the device automatically returns to display mode.

In the 'LOCAL CONTROL' and 'PLAY SCENE' submenus, the menu remains open even after 5 seconds of inactivity.

6.2 DMX and Art-Net settings

Setting the DMX address

The DMX start address is set and assigned to a channel via the 'ADDRESS' menu.

- **1.** Press [MENU] to activate the main menu.
- **2.** ▶ Press **v** or **a** repeatedly until the 'ADDRESS' submenu is shown on the display.
- **3.** ▶ Press ▶ to select the 'DMX-512A' submenu and confirm with [ENTER].
- **4.** Press [ENTER] to activate the Cursor.
- 5. Press ▼ or ▲ repeatedly until the display shows the desired DMX start address (display shows '001' ... '512') and confirm with [ENTER].

- ⇒ The value is confirmed. The parent menu level is displayed.
- **6.** ▶ Press ▶▶ to select the 'Patch:' submenu for channel selection.
- **7.** Press [ENTER] to activate the Cursor.
- **8.** Press ▶ to move the cursor between the fields 'Patch:' for channel selection and 'Start:' for entering the start address.
- Press ▼ or ▲ repeatedly until the display shows the desired channel (display shows '01' ... '12') or the desired start address (display shows '001' ... '512') and confirm with [ENTER].
 - ⇒ The DMX start address is assigned to the selected channel.

Setting the Art-Net address

The ArtNET address is set via the 'ADDRESS' menu.

- **1.** Press [MENU] to activate the main menu.
- **2.** ▶ Press **v** or **A** repeatedly until the 'ADDRESS' submenu is shown on the display.
- **3.** ▶ Press ▶ to select the 'ArtNET' submenu and confirm with [ENTER].
- Press ►► to select the 'SubNET:' submenu for a subnet or the 'Universe' submenu for an ArtNET universe and confirm with [ENTER].
- Press ▼ or ▲ repeatedly until the display shows the desired address for the subnet or the Art-Net universe (display shows '000'... '255') and confirm with [ENTER].
 - ⇒ The ArtNET address is assigned to the selected SubNET or ArtNET universe.

6.3 Dimmer settings

Setting parameters of the dimmer channel

The parameters of the selected dimmer channel are set via the 'LOCAL CONTROL' menu.

- **1.** Press [MENU] to activate the main menu.
- **2.** Press ▼ or ▲ repeatedly until the 'LOCAL CONTROL' submenu appears on the display and activate the submenu with [ENTER].
 - ⇒ The set dimmer channel flashes.
- **3.** ▶ Press ▶ to move the cursor to the number of the dimmer channel (display shows *'LIVE 123456789012'*) whose parameters you want to change.
- **4.** ▶ Press **v** or **A** repeatedly until the display shows the desired value for the selected dimmer channel.
- **5.** Press [ESC] to exit the menu and return to display mode.
 - \Rightarrow The set value is applied.

Setting the dimmer curve

The dimmer curve for individual or all channels is set via the 'CURVES' menu.

- **1.** Press [MENU] to activate the main menu.
- Press ▼ or ▲ repeatedly until the 'CURVES' submenu appears on the display and confirm with [ENTER].
 - ⇒ The cursor flashes at channel one.
- **3.** ▶ Press ▶ to move the cursor to the desired channel.
- Press ▼ or ▲ repeatedly until the display shows the desired dimmer curve (display shows 'Linear', 'Square' or 'NO-DIM') and confirm with [ENTER].
- **5.** To exit the menu without making changes, press [ESC].

6.4 Scenes

Saving a scene

| Menu level 1 | Menu level 2 | Function |

Scenes are saved via the 'SCENE REC/copy' menu.

- **1.** Press [MENU] to activate the main menu.
- **2.** ▶ Press **v** or **A** repeatedly until the 'SCENE REC' submenu is shown on the display.
- **3.** ▶ Press ▶▶ to select the 'Copy' submenu and confirm with [ENTER].
- Press ∇ or \triangle repeatedly until the display shows the number under which you want to save the scene (display shows '01' ... '99').

Scenes 71...99 are preset sample scenes. You can modify or overwrite them.

- **5.** ▶ Press ▶ to move the cursor to 'ENTER'.
 - ⇒ The 'ENTER' display flashes.
- **6.** ▶ Press [ENTER].
 - ⇒ The incoming DMX signal is saved as a scene under the set number. At the end of the saving process, the scene numbering display automatically jumps to the next higher number.

Setting a scene manually

Scenes can be created and saved manually using the 'SCENE REC/Assign' menu.

- **1.** Press [MENU] to activate the main menu.
- **2.** Press ∇ or \triangle repeatedly until the 'SCENE REC' submenu is shown on the display.
- **3.** ▶ Press ▶ to select the 'Assign' submenu and confirm with [ENTER].
- **4.** ▶ Press ▶▶ to move the cursor to the number of the channel whose value you want to change.

- Press ▼ or ▲ to set the dimmer value of the channels of the selected scene (display "01" ... '99' / 'FL').
- **6.** ▶ Press [ENTER].
 - ⇒ The set values are adopted. The display automatically jumps to the next scene.
- **7.** To exit the menu without making changes, press [ESC].

Playing a Chase

Chases are played via the 'PLAY SCENE/Chase' menu.

- **1.** Press [MENU] to activate the main menu.
- **2.** \triangleright Press \blacktriangledown or \blacktriangle repeatedly until the 'PLAY SCENE' submenu is shown on the display.
- **3.** ▶ Press ▶▶ to select the 'Chase' submenu and confirm with [ENTER].
- Press ▼ or ▲ until the display shows the number of the scene with which the chase should start (display shows '01'... '99').
- **5.** ▶ Press ▶ to move the cursor to the display mode options.
- **6.** ▶ Press **v** or **a** to select the play mode *'Once'* (single play) or *'Loop'* (loop playback).
- **7.** ▶ Press ▶ and then press ∇ or \triangle to select the fade time 'Fad1s...Fad9s'.
- **8.** ▶ Press ▶ and then press \triangledown or \blacktriangle to select the closing scene 'E01...E99'.
- **9.** Press [ENTER] to pause the chase (display |) or play (display >).

Playing a scene

Individual scenes are played via the 'PLAY SCENE/Scene' menu.

- **1.** Press [MENU] to activate the main menu.
- 2. ▶ Press ▼ or ▲ repeatedly until the 'PLAY SCENE' submenu is shown on the display.
- 3. ▶ Press ▶▶ to select the 'Scene' submenu and confirm with [ENTER].
- **4.** ▶ Press **v** or **a** to select the desired single scene (display shows 'Sc01' ... 'Sc99').
- **5.** Press [ENTER].
 - ⇒ The selected scene is played on the set channel.
- **6.** To exit the menu without making changes, press [ESC].

Selecting a control protocol

The control protocol is selected via the 'SETUP/Protocol Assign' menu.

- **1.** Press [MENU] to activate the main menu.
- **2.** \triangleright Press \blacktriangledown or \blacktriangle repeatedly until the *'SETUP'* submenu is shown on the display.
- **3.** ▶ Press ▶ to select the 'Protocol Assign' submenu and confirm with [ENTER].
- Press ▶ to move the cursor to the number of the channel to which you want to assign the control protocol.
- **5.** Press \triangledown or \blacktriangle to select either 'D' (DMX) or 'A' (ArtNET) and confirm with [ENTER].
 - ⇒ The control protocol for the selected channel is set.

Setting the behaviour on ArtNet signal failure

The 'SETUP/ArtNET Failed' menu is used to set how the device reacts when the ArtNET signal fails.

- **1.** Press [MENU] to activate the main menu.
- **2.** Press ∇ or \triangle repeatedly until the *'SETUP'* submenu is shown on the display.
- **3.** ▶ Press ▶ to select the 'ArtNET Failed' submenu and confirm with [ENTER].
- Press ▼ or ▲ to select the desired option for the behaviour of the device in the event of ArtNET control failure.
- **6.** Press [ENTER] to confirm the selection.
 - \Rightarrow The selected settings are adopted.
- **7.** To exit the menu without making changes, press [ESC].

Setting the behaviour on DMX signal failure

The 'SETUP/DMX Failed' menu is used to set how the device reacts when the DMX signal fails.

- **1.** Press [MENU] to activate the main menu.
- **2.** Press ∇ or \triangle repeatedly until the *'SETUP'* submenu is shown on the display.
- 3. ▶ Press ▶▶ to select the 'DMX Failed' submenu and confirm with [ENTER].
- Press ▼ or ▲ to select the desired option for the behaviour of the device in the event of ArtNET control failure.
- **6.** Press [ENTER] to confirm the selection.
 - ⇒ The selected settings are adopted.
- 7. To exit the menu without making changes, press [ESC].

Fan settings

The 'SETUP/Fan Cooling' menu is used to adjust the fan.

- **1.** Press [MENU] to activate the main menu.
- **2.** Press ∇ or \triangle repeatedly until the *'SETUP'* submenu is shown on the display.
- **3.** ▶ Press ▶ to select the 'Fan Cooling' submenu and confirm with [ENTER].
- Press ▼ or ▲ to select the desired option for the behaviour of the fan (display shows 'Normal', 'Silent', 'Full On').

- **5.** Press [ENTER] to confirm the selection.
 - ⇒ The selected settings are adopted.
- **6.** To exit the menu without making changes, press [ESC].

Reset to factory defaults

The 'SETUP/Factory Default' menu is used to reset the device to factory defaults.

- **1.** Press [MENU] to activate the main menu.
- **2.** Press ∇ or \triangle repeatedly until the *'SETUP'* submenu is shown on the display.
- **3.** ▶ Press ▶ to select the 'Factory Default' submenu and confirm with [ENTER].
 - ⇒ The display shows 'Confirm'.
- **4.** Press [ENTER] to confirm the selection.
 - ⇒ The device is reset to factory default settings.
- **5.** To exit the menu without making changes, press [ESC].

- **3.** ▶ Press ▶ to select the 'Software Version' submenu and confirm with [ENTER].
 - ⇒ The current software version of the device is displayed.
- **4.** ▶ Press ▶ to select the 'Temperature' submenu and confirm with [ENTER].
 - The device temperature for dimmers 1 to 6 (display shows 'L=') and dimmer 7 to 12 (display shows 'R=').
- **5.** To exit the menu, press [ESC].

8 Plug and connection assignment

Introduction

This chapter will help you select the right cables and plugs to connect your valuable equipment so that a perfect light experience is guaranteed.

Please take our tips, because especially in 'Sound & Light' caution is indicated: Even if a plug fits into a socket, the result of an incorrect connection may be a destroyed DMX controller, a short circuit or 'just' a not working light show!

DMX connections



Three- and five-pin XLR sockets serve as DMX outputs, a three- or five-pin XLR connector (optionally) serves as DMX input. The figure below and the table show the pin assignment.

9 Protecting the environment
