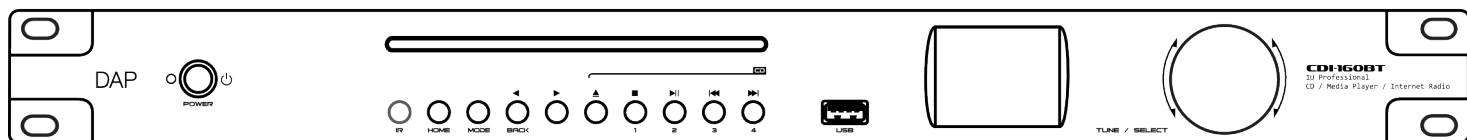

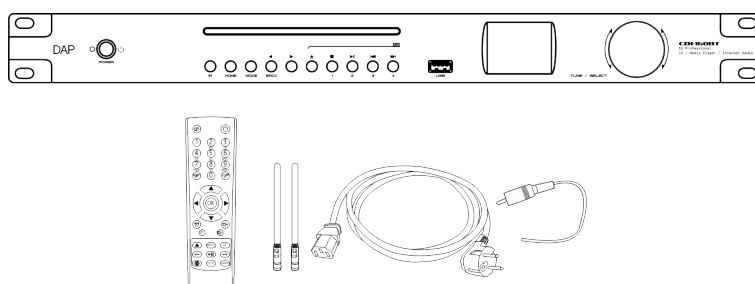

1.2. Intended Use

This device is intended for professional use as a CD and media player. It can be installed only indoors. This device is not suitable for households.

Any other use, not mentioned under intended use, is regarded as non-intended and incorrect use.

2.1. Warnings and Safety Instructions

3. Description of the Device

The DAP CDI-160BT is a CD and media player and is designed for installation into a 19-inch rack. The device features DAB+, FM and an internet radio, as well as a USB port and Bluetooth 5.0. There are both balanced and unbalanced outputs on the back of the device. The player can be operated using the controls on the front or with the included IR remote control.

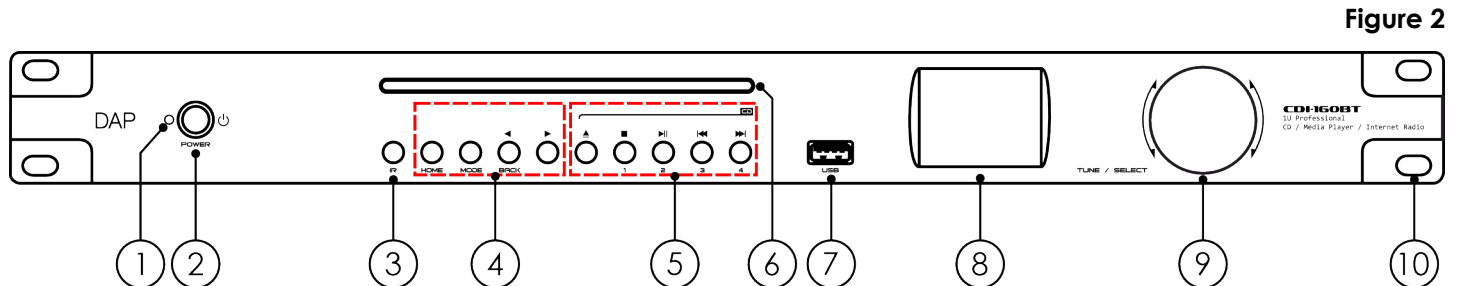

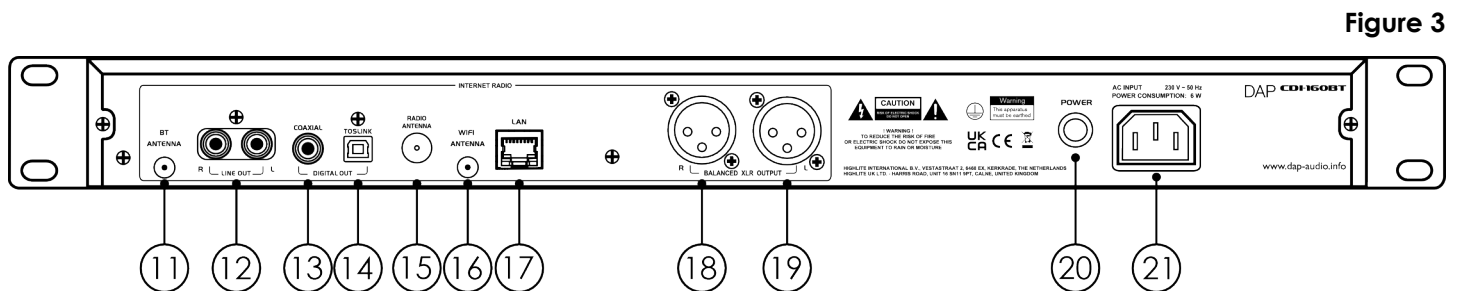

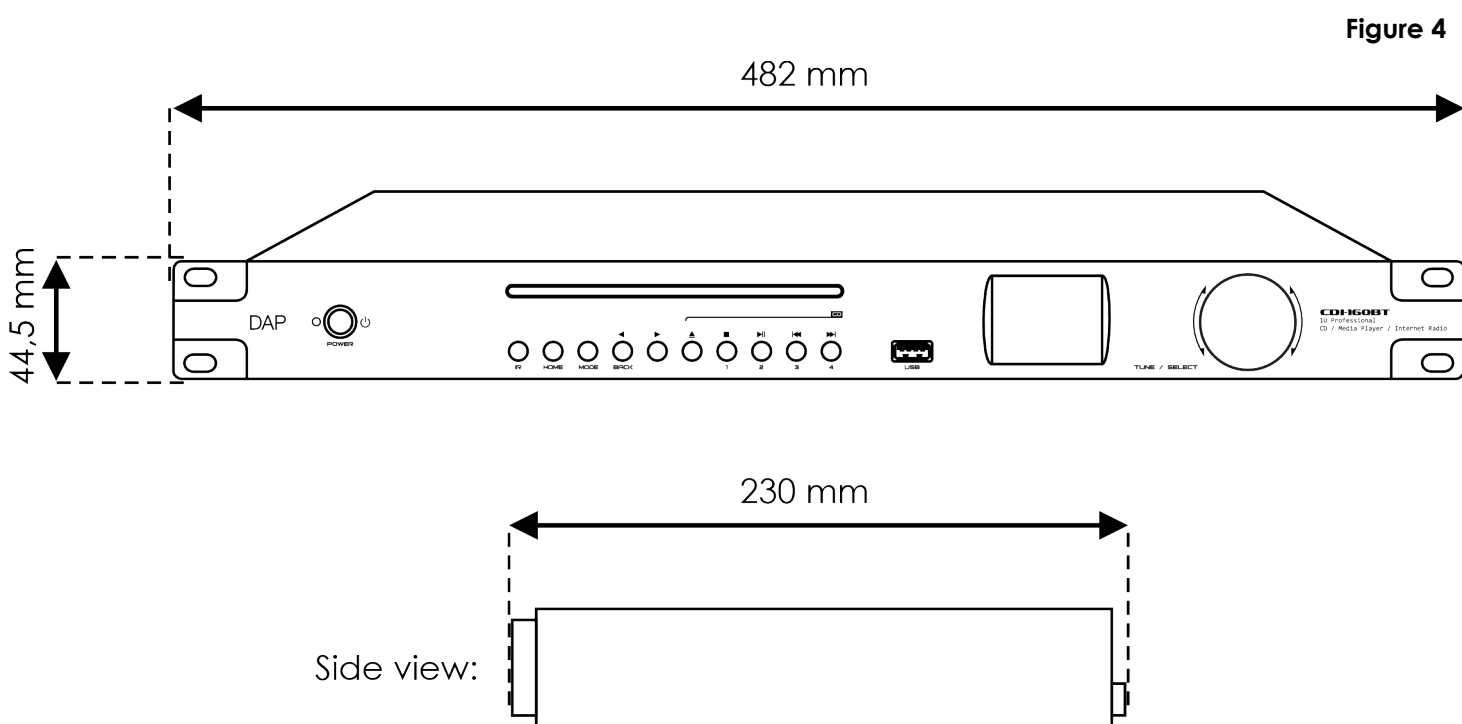

4. Installation

4.1. Installation Site Requirements

- The device can be used only indoors.
- The ambient temperature must be in the range 0 and 40 °C.
- The relative humidity must not exceed 50 % with an ambient temperature of 40 °C.

4.2. Rack Mounting

The device can be mounted in a standard 19-inch rack. The device requires 1 rack unit (RU) of space, which is 44,5 mm high.

Make sure that the rack is sufficiently secured to prevent it from becoming unstable or falling over.

To mount the device in a two-post rack, follow the steps below:

- 01) Insert 4 cage nuts in the openings on the rack posts where you want to mount the device.
- 02) Position the device in front of the rack posts so that the 4 **mounting openings (10)** on the flanges face the openings on the rack posts with cage nuts.
- 03) Use a screwdriver to mount the device to the rack posts with 4 screws.

4.3. Connecting the Wireless Antennas

The device is delivered with 2 wireless antennas. The antennas are not connected. To install the antennas:

- 01) Put the 2 wireless antennas into the **BT antenna connector (11)** and the **Wi-Fi antenna connector (16)**.
- 02) Turn the 2 wireless antennas clockwise to tighten them.
- 03) Make sure that the wireless antennas point up.

4.4. Connecting the DAB/FM Wire Antenna

- 01) Put the DAB/FM wire antenna into the **DAB/FM wire antenna connector (15)**.
- 02) Unwind the DAB/FM wire antenna to improve the reception.

4.5. Connecting the Device to a Router

To make a LAN connection, it is necessary to connect the device to a router.

- 01) Plug one end of the network cable into an RJ45 connector on the router.
- 02) Plug the other end of the network cable into the **RJ45 LAN connector IN (17)** on the device.

Note:

If you use a network cable and the DHCP function on the router is activated, it is not necessary to configure the network.

4.6. Connecting to Power Supply



DANGER
Electric shock caused by short-circuit

The device accepts AC mains power at 220–240 V and 50 Hz. Do not supply power at any other voltage or frequency to the device.

This device falls under IEC protection class I. Make sure that the device is always electrically connected to the ground (earth).

Before connecting the device to the socket-outlet:

- Make sure that the power supply matches the input voltage specified on the information label on the device.
- Make sure that the socket-outlet has ground (earth) connection.

Connect the device to the socket-outlet with the power plug.

4.7. Installation of the Batteries

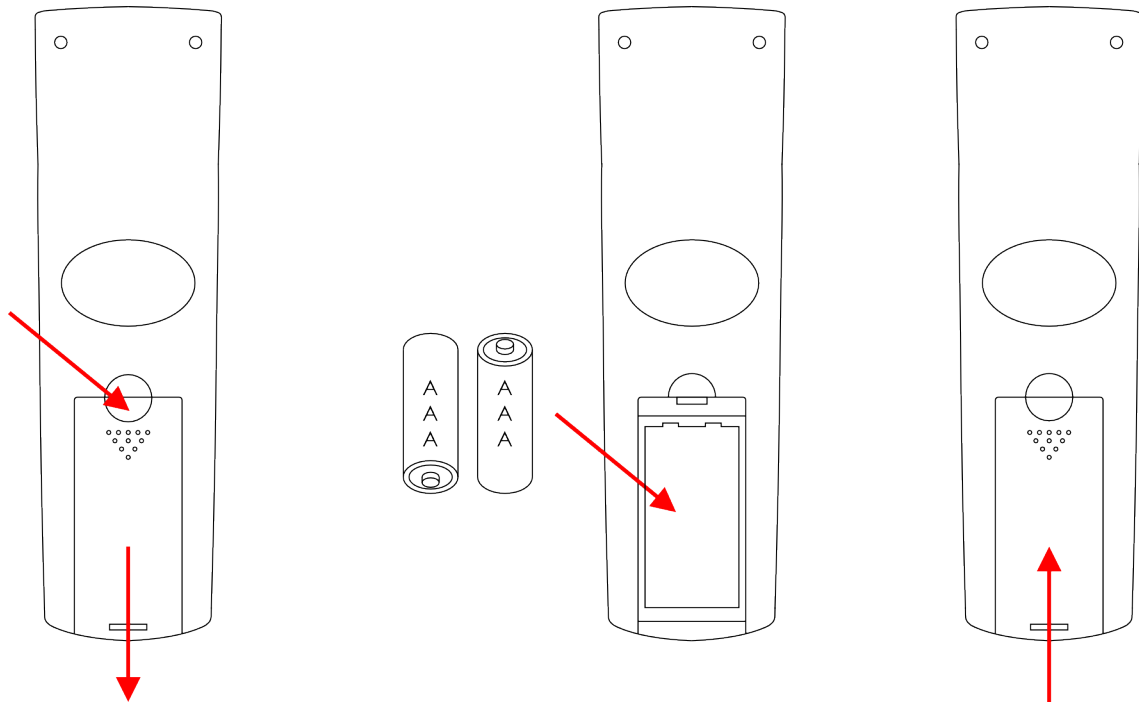
The device can be operated with an IR remote control. The remote control is included in the delivery.

The remote control is delivered without batteries. It accepts 2 x AAA 1,5 V (alkaline) batteries.

To install the batteries:

- 01) Press on the battery compartment cover and slide it downwards to open the battery compartment.
- 02) Insert 2 x AAA 1,5 V batteries into the battery housing. Make sure that you install the batteries with correct polarity orientation.
- 03) Close the battery compartment cover.

5. Setup

5.1. Warnings and Precautions



Attention

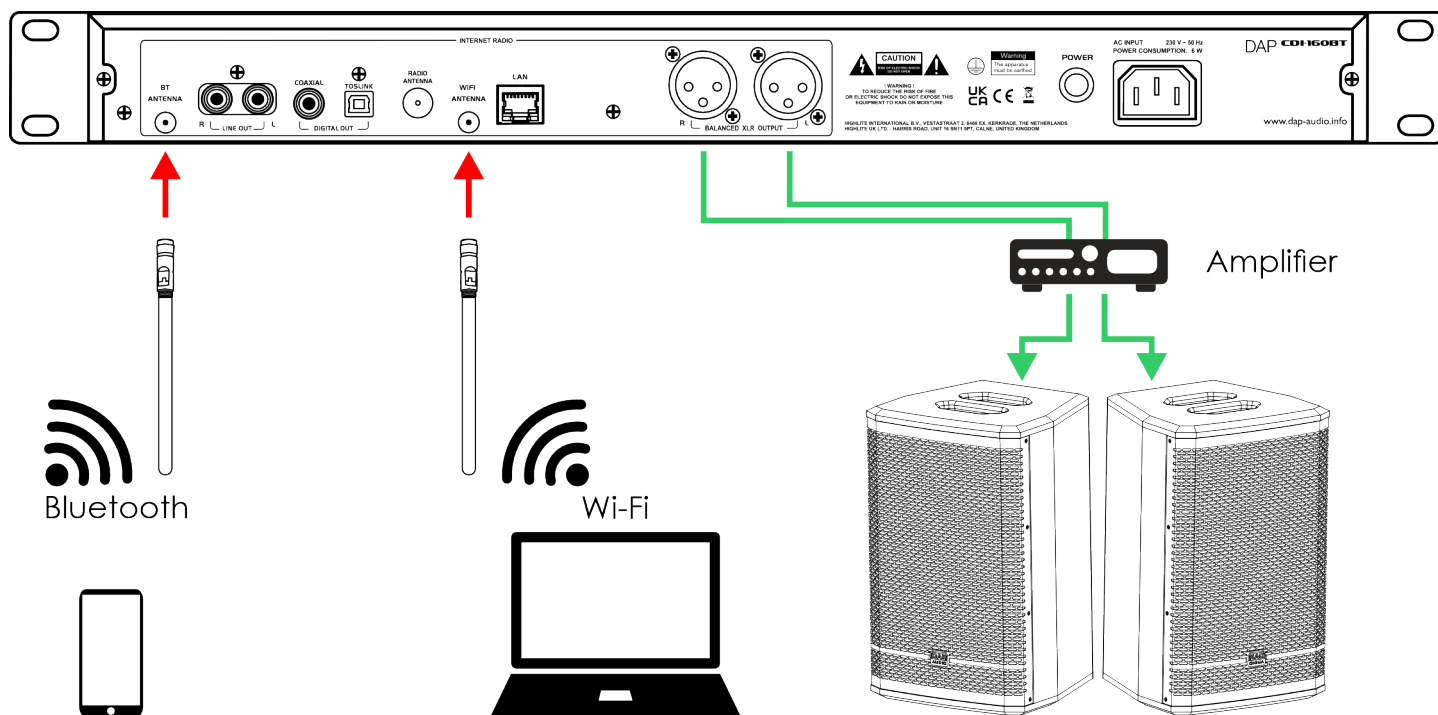
Connect all data cables before supplying power.

Disconnect power supply before connecting or disconnecting data cables.

5.2. Setup Example

The figure below shows a typical setup with 2 streaming devices and 2 active speakers connected through an amplifier to the device.

5.3. Turning On/Off/Stand-by

The device has a power switch and a stand-by switch.

5.3.1. Power switch On/Off

- Set the **power switch (20)** to ON position to turn on the device.
- Set the **power switch (20)** to OFF position to turn off the device.

Make sure that the device is turned off with the **power switch (20)** when the device is not in use.

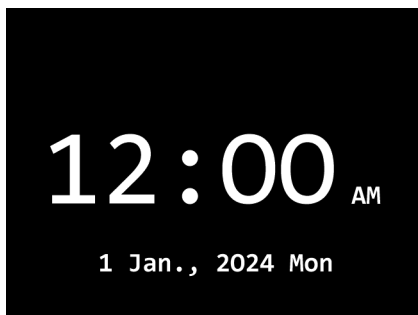
Note:

The alarm function does not work when the device is turned off.

5.3.2. Stand-by

When the device is not in use, it can operate in Stand-by mode.

- 01) Press the **stand-by button (02)** to turn the stand-by function on. The **stand-by LED indicator (01)** will light blue. The display shows the date and time.



- 02) Press the **stand-by button (02)** again to turn the stand-by function off. The **stand-by LED indicator (01)** will turn off. The display shows the main menu.

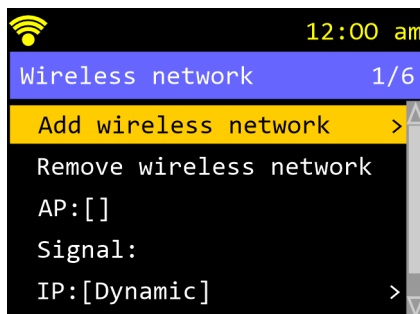
5.4. Network Setup

You can connect the CDI-160BT to a computer, laptop, tablet or smartphone with a wireless module (Wi-Fi). You can also connect the devices with a CAT-5 cable (LAN).

5.4.1. Wi-Fi Setup

You can set up Wi-Fi via the Configuration menu (see [7.12. Configuration](#) on page 35) and Network submenus (see [7.12.1. Network](#)).

In this section, you can connect the device to the router. You can configure the network connection in one of the 2 ways: Scan or with WPS.



- 01) Turn the **tune/select control (09)** to choose Add wireless network.
- 02) Press the **tune/select control (09)** to confirm.
- 03) Turn the **tune/select control (09)** to choose Scan & Select (see [5.4.1.1. Scan & Select](#)) or WPS (see [5.4.1.2. WPS](#)) button.
- 04) Press the **tune/select control (09)** to confirm.

5.4.1.1. Scan & Select

If you choose Scan & Select, the device will scan for available routers:

- 01) Turn the **tune/select control (09)** to choose a router.
- 02) Press the **tune/select control (09)** to confirm.
- 03) If required, enter the network password (see [5.5. Entering Text](#) on page 15).

5.4.1.2. WPS

If you choose WPS button, the device will scan for available WPS routers:

- 01) Turn the **tune/select control (09)** to choose a router.
- 02) Press the **tune/select control (09)** to confirm.
- 03) Press the WPS button on your router to connect.

5.4.2. LAN Setup

If the device is connected to the router with a network cable, internet access is automatic. No further actions are necessary.

5.4.3. Network Indicator Display Status

The network indicator is visible in the upper left corner of the display. It has the following 2 statuses:

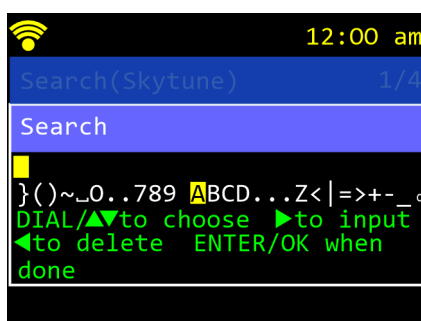


Wi-Fi internet connection

5.5. Entering Text



To enter a password or search for phrases:

- 01) Turn the **tune/select control (09)** to choose characters.
- 02) Press the **FORWARD button (D)** to confirm.
- 03) If you make a mistake, press the **BACK button (C)** to remove the wrong character.
- 04) Repeat steps 01–03 to type in the desired word or phrase.
- 05) Press the **tune/select control (09)** to confirm.

The available characters are uppercase letters, digits, punctuation marks, and some symbols.

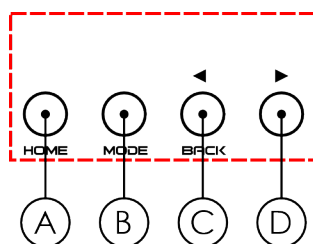

6.3. Control Buttons

- A) HOME button
- B) MODE button
- C) BACK button
- D) FORWARD button

- Use the **HOME** button to exit the current submenu and return to the main menu.
- Use the **MODE** button to cycle through and select available modes.
- Use the **BACK** button to return to the previous screen or decrease values.
- Use the **FORWARD** button to move forward or increase values.

6.4. Start-up

If you start the device for the first time, you will have to choose the menu language and configure the wireless network. You need to perform these actions only once.

6.4.1. Choosing Menu Language

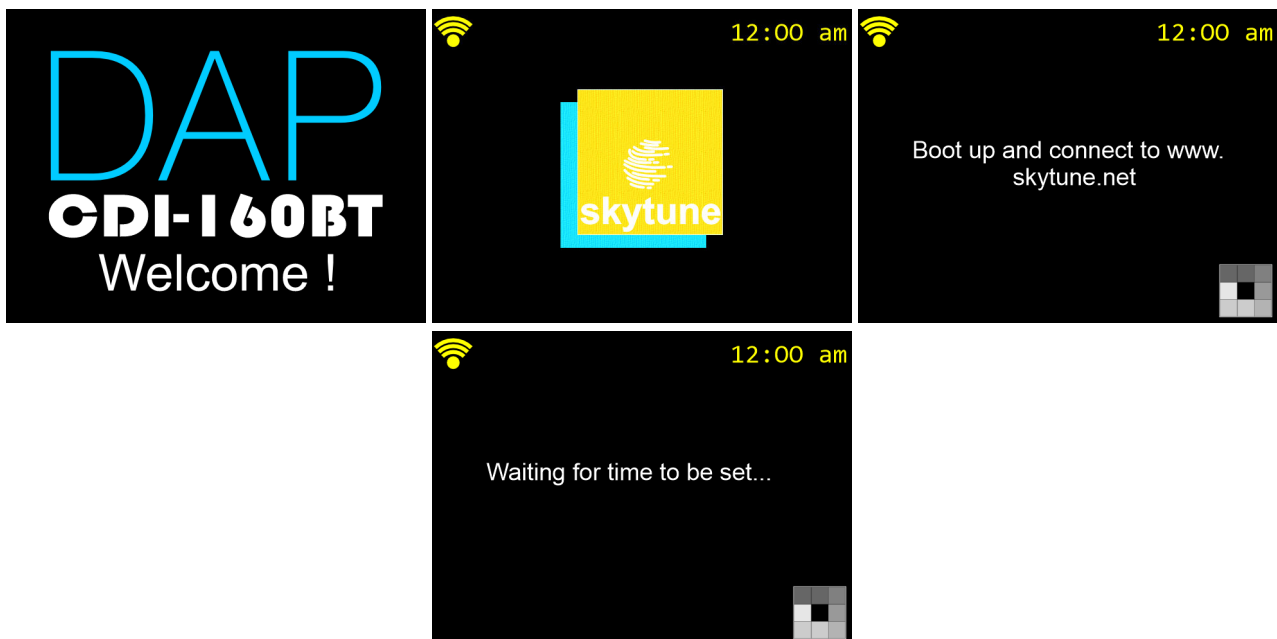
When starting up for the first time, you will have to select a language (see [7.12.3. Language](#) on page 39).

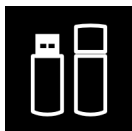

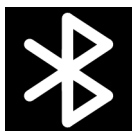

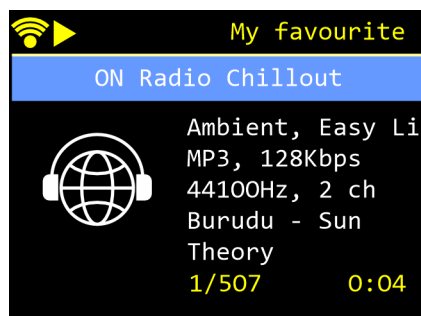
7.1. My Favourite

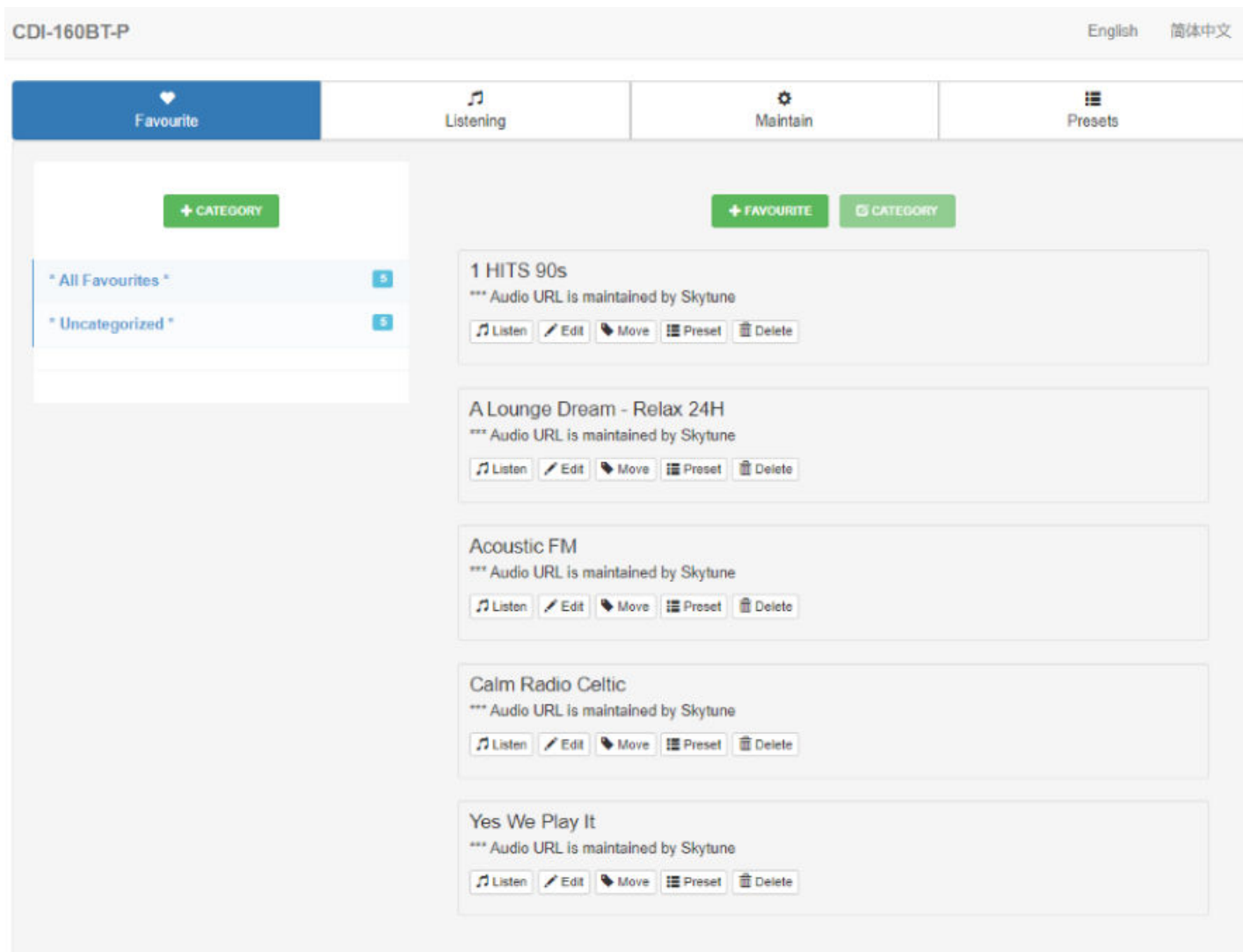
- 01) Turn the **tune/select control (09)** to choose one of the available radio stations.

7.1.1. Managing Favourites, Presets and Listening Options With a PC or Smartphone

You can view, listen to, manage and maintain favourites, control listening options and view, listen to and manage presets with a PC or smartphone.

- 01) Connect your PC/smartphone to the same Wi-Fi network as the CDI-160BT.
- 02) Find the IP address of the CDI-160BT (see [7.12.15. Network Information](#) on page 46).
- 03) Open an internet browser.



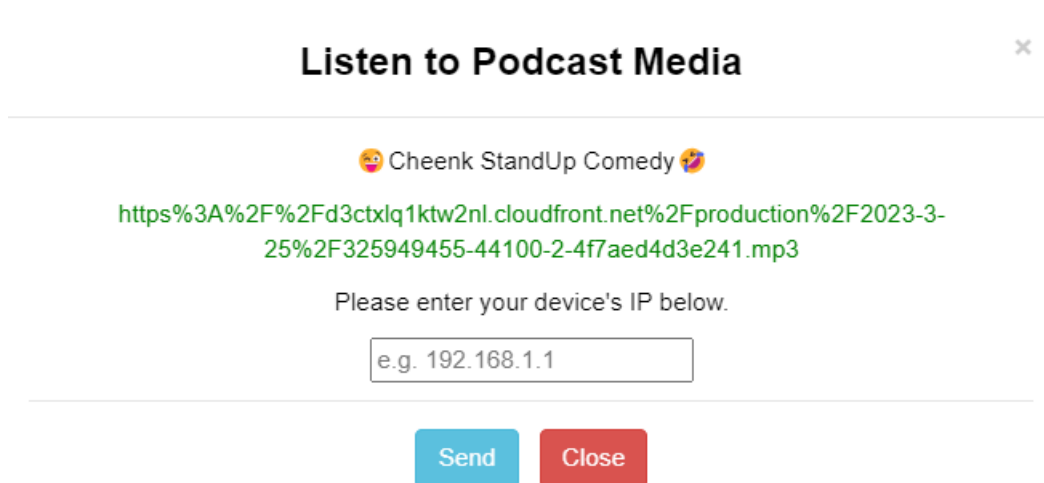
