## 2 Safety instructions

### Intended use

This device is intended for use as an electronic lighting effect by means of LED technology. The device is designed for professional use only and is not suitable for use in households. Use the device only as described in this user manual. Any other use or use under other operating conditions is considered to be improper and may result in personal injury or property damage. No liability will be assumed for damages resulting from improper use.

This device may be used only by persons with sufficient physical, sensorial, and intellectual abilities and having corresponding knowledge and experience. Other persons may use this device only if they are supervised or instructed by a person who is responsible for their safety.



*Extend the operating life of the device by regular breaks and by avoiding frequent switching on and off. The device is not suitable for continuous operation.*

**Safety****DANGER!****Danger for children**

Ensure that plastic bags, packaging, etc. are disposed of properly and are not within reach of babies and young children. Choking hazard! Ensure that children do not detach any small parts (e.g. knobs or the like) from the unit. They could swallow the pieces and choke! Never let children unattended use electrical devices.

**DANGER!****Electric shock caused by high voltages inside**

Within the device there are areas where high voltages may be present. Never remove any covers. There are no user-serviceable parts inside. Do not use the device if covers, protectors or optical components are missing or damaged.

**DANGER!****Electric shock caused by short-circuit**

Do not modify the mains cable or the plug. Failure to do so could result in electric shock/death or fire. If in doubt, seek advice from a registered electrician.

**WARNING!****Eye damage caused by high light intensity**

Never look directly into the light source.



### **WARNING!**

#### **Risk of epileptic shock**

Strobe lighting can trigger seizures in photosensitive epilepsy. Sensitive persons should avoid looking at strobe lights.



### **NOTICE!**

#### **Risk of fire**

Do not block areas of ventilation. Do not install the device near any direct heat source. Keep the device away from naked flames.



### **NOTICE!**

#### **Operating conditions**

This device has been designed for indoor use only. To prevent damage, never expose the device to any liquid or moisture. Avoid direct sunlight, heavy dirt, and strong vibrations. Only operate the device within the ambient conditions specified in the chapter 'Technical specifications' of this user manual. Avoid heavy temperature fluctuations and do not switch the device on immediately after it was exposed to temperature fluctuations (for example after transport at low outside temperatures). Dust and dirt inside can damage the unit. When operated in harmful ambient conditions (dust, smoke, nicotine, fog, etc.), the unit should be maintained by qualified service personnel at regular intervals to prevent overheating and other malfunction.



### **NOTICE!**

#### **Power supply**

Before connecting the device, ensure that the input voltage (AC outlet) matches the voltage rating of the device and that the AC outlet is protected by a residual current circuit breaker. Failure to do so could result in damage to the device and possibly injure the user. Unplug the device before electrical storms occur and when it is unused for long periods of time to reduce the risk of electric shock or fire.

### 3 Features

Special features of the device:

- 12 × 1 watt TrueColour LED (each 3 × red, green, blue and white)
- Stand-alone, master-slave or DMX mode operation
- Operation via buttons and display on the unit or via an optionally available infrared remote control
- Compact plastic housing
- Housing colour
  - black: LED Pot 12×1W RGBW (item no. 377666)
  - white: LED Pot 12×1W WH RGBW (item no. 512676)
- Universal two-piece mounting bracket for hanging or standing installation
- Suitable for use in clubs, bars, theatres, exhibitions, etc. or for architectural lighting

For technological reasons, the light output of LEDs decreases over their lifetime. This effect increases with higher operating temperature. You can extend the service life of the illuminants by providing adequate ventilation and operating the LEDs with the lowest possible brightness.

## 4 Installation

Unpack and check carefully there is no transportation damage before using the unit. Keep the equipment packaging. To fully protect the product against vibration, dust and moisture during transportation or storage use the original packaging or your own packaging material suitable for transport or storage, respectively.



**WARNING!**

**Risk of injury caused by falling objects**

Make sure that the installation complies with the standards and rules that apply in your country. Always secure the device with a secondary safety attachment, such as a safety cable or a safety chain.



**NOTICE!**

**Risk of overheating**

The distance between light output and the illuminated surface must be more than 1.5 m (19.7in).

Provide sufficient ventilation.

The ambient temperature must always be below 40 °C (104 °F).



**NOTICE!**

**Use of stands**

When mounting the device onto a stand, ensure that the stand is in a safe and stable position and that the weight of the device does not exceed the maximum permissible load capacity of the stand.



### **NOTICE!**

#### **Possible data transmission errors**

For error-free operation make use of dedicated DMX cables and do not use ordinary microphone cables.

Never connect the DMX input or output to audio devices such as mixers or amplifiers.

### **Mounting options**

You can install the unit in hanging or standing position. When in use, the device must always be attached to a solid surface or an approved truss. Use the openings provided on the two-piece bracket for attaching.

Always work from a stable platform whenever installing, moving or servicing the unit. In doing so, the area underneath the unit must be cordoned off.

The safety cable must be attached to the bracket.




*Please note that this device must not be connected to a dimmer.*

## 5 Starting up

Create all connections while the device is off. Use the shortest possible high-quality cables for all connections. Take care when running the cables to prevent tripping hazards.

## Connections in DMX mode

Connect the DMX input of the device to the DMX output of a DMX controller or another DMX device. Connect the output of the first DMX device to the input of the second one, and so on to form a daisy chain. Always ensure that the output of the last DMX device in the daisy chain is terminated with a resistor ( $110\ \Omega$ ,  $\frac{1}{4}\ \text{W}$ ).




LED Pot 12×1W RGBW, LED Pot 12×1W WH RGBW

### **Connections in master/slave mode**

When you configure a group of devices in master/slave mode, the first unit will control the other units for an automatic, sound-activated, synchronized show. This function is ideal when you want to start a show immediately. Connect the DMX output of the master device to the DMX input of the first slave device. Then connect the DMX output of the first slave device to the DMX input of the second slave device and so on.

## 6 Connections and operating elements

### Rear panel




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1	Locking screws for the mounting bracket.
2	Light aperture.
3	Infrared sensor for receiving signals from an optionally available remote control
4	<i>[DMX In]</i> DMX input.
5	Power cord.
6	<i>[DMX Out]</i> DMX output.
7	Display.
8	Button <i>[Down]</i> Decreases the displayed value by one.
9	Button <i>[Up]</i> Increases the displayed value by one.
10	Two-piece bracket for hanging or installation and for securing the safety rope.

**Remote control (optional)**



13	<i>[AUTO]</i> Enables the auto mode.
14	<i>[PRG]</i> Enables the Programme mode. Select the desired programme with the buttons <i>[+]</i> and <i>[-]</i> .
15	<i>[ON/OFF]</i> Activates / deactivates the device.
16	<i>[SPEED]</i> Activates the setting mode for the programme speed. Adjust the speed using the buttons <i>[+]</i> and <i>[-]</i> .
17	<i>[SOUND]</i> Activates the sound control.
18	<i>[STROBE]</i> Turns the strobe function on / off.
19	<i>[+]</i> Increases the set value.

20	<i>[-]</i> Decreases the set value.
21	<i>[Dimming]</i> Enables the dimmer function.
22	<i>[0 ... 9]</i> Numeric buttons for direct selection of a constant colour.
23	<i>[R], [G], [B], [A], [W]</i> Buttons to select a colour tone for the dimmer mode.

## 7 Operating

### 7.1 Starting the device

Connect the device to the power supply to start operation. After a few seconds the unit is ready for use.

### 7.2 Main menu

Press *[Mode]* to activate the main menu. Press again *[Mode]* or *[Up]* | *[Down]* to call up other menu items. To activate the respectively shown menu item, press *[Setup]*. Use *[Up]* and *[Down]* to change the respectively displayed value. Changed values and settings will immediately take effect. Press *[Mode]* to return to the previous menu.

If you do not press any button for about 15 seconds, the display will turn off. The set values are retained even when the device is disconnected from the mains power supply.

### **Auto mode**

Press *[Mode]* or *[Up]* | *[Down]* repeatedly until the display shows 'AUTO'. The unit now operates in automatic stand-alone mode.

### **Programme mode**

Press *[Mode]* or *[Up]* | *[Down]* repeatedly until the display shows 'Pro'. Press *[Setup]* to then select with *[Up]* | *[Down]* one of the programmes 'Pr.01' - 'Pr.14'.

If you select 'Pr.01', you can press *[Setup]* and then use *[Up]* | *[Down]* to select 15 programmed colour patterns that are constantly lighting. Or you select '-OFF' to blackout the unit. Press *[Setup]* to then select with *[Up]* | *[Down]* the strobe frequency from 'FS.01' (slow) to 'FS.99' (fast). Select 'FS.00' for constant light.

Programmes 'Pr.02' - 'Pr.14' offer preprogrammed colour sequences. After selecting one of these programmes, press *[Setup]* to then select with *[Up]* | *[Down]* the speed of the colour sequences from 'SP.01' (slow) to 'SP.FL' (fast). Press *[Setup]* to then select with *[Up]* | *[Down]* the strobe frequency from 'FS.01' (slow) to 'FS.99' (fast).

**DMX address**

Press *[Mode]* or *[Up]* | *[Down]* repeatedly until the display shows 'd---'. Press *[Setup]* to then select with *[Up]* | *[Down]* the desired DMX address between 1 and 512 (the display shows 'd.001' ... 'd.512'). Make sure that this number matches the configuration of your DMX controller.

Press *[Setup]* to then select with *[Up]* | *[Down]* the number of channels (4, 6 or 8) available for DMX operation.

**Slave mode**

Press *[Mode]* or *[Up]* | *[Down]* repeatedly until the display shows 'SLAv'. The device is now working in slave mode, i.e. it will exactly copy the movement of the controlling master device, correct wiring provided.

**Colour mode**

Press *[Mode]* or *[Up]* | *[Down]* repeatedly until the display shows 'Colr'. All LEDs light with full intensity. Press *[Setup]* to then select with *[Up]* | *[Down]* the intensity of the red LEDs between 'r.000' (off) and 'r.255' (full). Press *[Setup]* to then select with *[Up]* | *[Down]* the intensity of the green LEDs between 'g.000' (off) and 'g.255' (full). Press *[Setup]* to then select with *[Up]* | *[Down]* the intensity of the blue LEDs between 'b.000' (off) and 'b.255' (full). Press *[Setup]* to then select with *[Up]* | *[Down]* the intensity of the white LEDs between 'u.000' (off) and 'u.255' (full).

### **Sound mode**

Press *[Mode]* or *[Up]* | *[Down]* repeatedly until the display shows 'Soud'. Confirm the selection with *[Setup]*. Use *[Up]* | *[Down]* to select a mode between 'SO.01' ... 'SO.12'. Confirm the selection with *[Setup]*. Use *[Up]* | *[Down]* to adjust the microphone sensitivity in a range from 'SU.00' ... 'SU.31'.


### **Resetting the device**

Press *[Mode]* or *[Up]* | *[Down]* repeatedly until the display shows 'SEt'. Press *[Setup]*, the display shows '-rSt'. If you press *[Setup]* again during the display, the device is being reset to factory defaults. All your previously adjusted settings are thereby being irretrievably erased. Press 'MODE' to cancel the procedure.

### **Information display**

Press *[Mode]* or *[Up]* | *[Down]* repeatedly until the display shows 'InFo'. Press *[Setup]*, the display shows 'tEnP'. Press *[Setup]* again. The display shows 't-on'. If you press *[Up]* or *[Down]* while the display shows 'tEnP', the display shows 'VER'. Press *[Setup]* to let the device show the firmware version.



## 9 Plug and connection assignments

### Introduction

This chapter will help you select the right cables and plugs to connect your valuable equipment so that a perfect light experience is guaranteed.

Please take our tips, because especially in 'Sound & Light' caution is indicated: Even if a plug fits into a socket, the result of an incorrect connection may be a destroyed DMX controller, a short circuit or 'just' a not working light show!

### DMX connections



The unit offers a 3-pin XLR socket for DMX output and a 3-pin XLR plug for DMX input. Please refer to the drawing and table below for the pin assignment of a suitable XLR plug.

Pin	Configuration
1	Ground, shielding
2	Signal inverted (DMX-, 'cold signal')
3	Signal (DMX+, 'hot signal')

## 10 Troubleshooting



### **NOTICE!**

#### **Possible data transmission errors**

For error-free operation make use of dedicated DMX cables and do not use ordinary microphone cables.

Never connect the DMX input or output to audio devices such as mixers or amplifiers.

In the following we list a few common problems that may occur during operation. We give you some suggestions for easy troubleshooting:

Symptom	Remedy
The unit does not work, no light.	Check the mains connection and the fuse.
No response to the DMX controller.	1. Check the DMX ports and cables for proper connection.
	2. Check the address settings and the DMX polarity.
	3. Try using another DMX controller.
	4. Check to see if the DMX cables run near or alongside to high voltage cables that may cause damage or interference to DMX interface circuits.

## 11 Cleaning

### Optical lenses

Clean the optical lenses, that are accessible from the outside, regularly in order to optimize the light output. The frequency of cleaning depends on the operating environment: wet, smoky or particularly dirty surroundings can cause more accumulation of dirt on the optics of the device.

- Clean with a soft cloth using our lamp and lens cleaner (item no. 280122).
- Always dry the parts carefully.

### Fan grids

The fan grids of the device must be cleaned of any contamination, such as dust, etc. on a regular basis. Before cleaning, switch off the device and disconnect mains-operated devices from the mains. Only use pH-neutral, solvent-free and non-abrasive cleaning agents. Clean the unit with a slightly damp lint-free cloth.

## 12 Protecting the environment

### Disposal of the packaging material



For the transport and protective packaging, environmentally friendly materials have been chosen that can be supplied to normal recycling.

Ensure that plastic bags, packaging, etc. are properly disposed of.

Do not just dispose of these materials with your normal household waste, but make sure that they are fed to a recovery. Please follow the notes and markings on the packaging.

### Disposal of batteries
